INTENT	The intent of our PSHE curriculum:	Is that when children leave Caedmon Primary, they will do so with the knowledge, understanding and emotions to be able to play an active, positive and successful role in today's diverse society. We want our children to have high aspirations and a belief in themselves. Our PSHE curriculum develops learning and results in the acquisition of knowledge and skills which will enable children to access the wider curriculum and prepare them to be good citizens now and in the future. It promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils, preparing them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences for later life. Our Relationships Education enables our children to learn how to understand and develop healthy relationships, both now and in their future lives.
IMPLEMENTATION	The experiences your children will receive:	Have been created to meet the specific needs of our pupils. In Nursery and Reception, PSHE is taught as part of the 'Personal, Social and Emotional Development' and the 'Understanding the World' aspects of the curriculum. Across the rest of the school, PSHE is taught as a dedicated lesson each week. The key concepts for PSHE are: Physical Health and Wellbeing/Mental Health and Wellbeing, Keeping Safe and Managing Risk, and Identity, Society and Equality. These key concepts thread through each of the six topic areas across the year and underpin our curriculum. Each theme is re-visited each year on a spiral curriculum. Each year, we aim to build upon current skills, ensuring it is age appropriate and relevant to the needs of our children. As a school, we actively seek opportunities to enrich our curriculum with real-life experiences and scenarios. During the academic year, we invite into school a range of guest speakers, such as: local police, local councillors, local business owners and other important members of our community who help to bring our learning to life. This may be delivered through assemblies or workshops with specific year groups.
