Introduction

It is the policy of the school that all children wear uniform when attending the school or a school-organised event within or outside normal school hours.

Where to buy uniform

Uniform with the school logo can be purchased from our school office e.g. Caedmon jumper or cardigan. Uniform can also be purchased from supermarkets in the local area or online.

Do I need to buy uniform with a logo?

At Caedmon Primary, we provide one school cardigan or jumper free of charge and this has a logo. This is the only item that has a logo. After this, you may choose whether to buy items with a logo or without a logo.

Do I need to buy PE Kit?

At Caedmon Primary, we provide a white t-shirt and black shorts for each pupil – free of charge and this is washed and dried in school. If preferred, parents/carers can choose to provide shorts and t-shirt. Other PE kit (see below) is provided by parents or carers.

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| Nursery and Reception pupils should wear Velcro shoes that can easily be fastened | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the summer, children in Years 1-6 may wear white, flat supportive sandals with plain coloured socks. Please ensure that they are suitable for school. If you are unsure please contact the school before making a purchase - we are more than happy to help. |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All children will be provided with a P.E. kit (shorts and t-shirt) free of charge or you can choose to provide your own. All clothing should be labelled with the child's name. <p>Children who need to be excused from P.E. for medical reasons must bring in a letter signed by a parent/carer.</p> | |

| Swimming Kit | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> One-piece swimsuit for girls (no bikinis) and trunks for boys (not baggy swim-shorts). A towel | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Goggles (see below) |
| Important notes: | |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No goggles – unless a letter is provided for the swimming teacher. All clothing should be labelled with the child's name. Pupils with long hair (below the shoulder) will also need a band to tie up their hair. If children do not bring a swimming kit one will be provided by the school for one session (if possible). <p>Children who need to be excused from swimming for medical reasons must bring in a letter signed by a parent/carer.</p> | |

| Jewellery | |

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| Important notes on jewellery: |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For health and safety reasons, all watches and ear studs must be removed for P.E. and swimming. Your child is responsible for removing and storing these items of jewellery during P.E. lessons. If you are considering having your child's ears pierced please do so at the beginning of the summer holidays when this will not interfere with P.E. lessons. • We do not accept responsibility for any accident, loss or damage caused by or relating to, the wearing of jewellery. |

| Hair & Make-up | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Appropriately styled hair • Small bow(s) • Hairbands, ribbons, bobbles • Hair slides (small details are allowed e.g. hair slide with a small bow). | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mohicans • Shaved heads/patterns • Bright colours/hair dye • Extreme hairstyles • Make up or fake tan • Nail varnish or false nails |

The Headteacher may grant exceptions to any of the above, but only if this is required as a matter of sincere religious observance. A letter from the relevant religious community must support this.

If your child has a diagnosed medical condition that affects their feet, please speak to the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher.

No policy can cover all eventualities. On all matters regarding school uniform, the Headteacher's decision is final.

Naming Clothes and Lost Property

Many children are careless with their personal possessions and we are constantly filling the lost property box with unclaimed items – especially coats. Please help by ensuring that all property and items of clothing and footwear are clearly marked with your child's name.

Finance / Second-Hand Uniform Shop

We understand that for some families finances are tight. We believe that by doing all we can to eradicate fashion items at the school, we are assisting all families in keeping costs down. If you do have a particular problem, or you are unsure about an item of clothing, please do not hesitate to contact the Headteacher, who will deal with your enquiry in the strictest confidence.

We have a second-hand uniform shop where items, including shoes and coats, are on sale at very low cost e.g. 50p for trousers. We welcome donations.

The Role of the Governing Body

The Governing Body supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy.

Monitoring and Review

The Governing Body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy annually.
